Every year **>5000 people** across the UK will be diagnosed with a malignant NEN

>60% will have seen their GP four times or more before hospital referral

Up to **80%** will have stage IV disease at diagnosis

>30% will have high-grade/aggressive disease

Up to **25%** will have an underlying genetic component eg MEN1

One third will have had or will develop another form of cancer
